

You will be happy to know that the table rents from the 10th Annual Country Churchmouse Bazaar made enough money to purchase a bodacious long heater (50 feet) for the Tabernacle. It is a surface heater, as are the other four. It cost \$3,375. That should make it much toastier in there on cold days. It is mounted towards the back of the auditorium. This will increase the usability of the building a lot and bring in more revenue. That is a happy thought.

Bazaar monies also purchased an ad in the Christian News Northwest that appears monthly. We will continue to do that. It mentions retreat deals and other activities on the Convention grounds.

We also had \$1,000 to put into the general fund to help with the ongoing expenses of keeping up the building.

We had 80 spaces each weekend of the Bazaar, and except for a few last minute people not able to come, they were full. Our crafters/artists/vendors are the greatest. God bless 'em all - they really helped us help the Tabernacle. A big thanks & God bless ya to all who helped.

A WORD ABOUT MONEY

As we mentioned last fall, we started this year with a good carryover in funds to start our new fiscal year. At this point we have used up most of that carryover, and are still operating in the black! We raised \$26,178 in matching funds toward the \$30,000 challenge! We received the full \$30,000 from the challenge donor, so were able to put \$43,000 toward the principal of the CDF Line of Credit loan and retain enough to ensure that all monthly payments can be met up through July 10. Any balance will be sent toward the principal. We are praising God for the faithfulness of His people! (That means YOU!)

We have booked a significant increase in rental groups for this year of 2005. If we can make it through February without borrowing anything toward operating funds, we will surely finish this fiscal year without any additional indebtedness.

We are planning toward April and May when we expect some volunteer help from MMAPs and SOS to join us to assist with the projects of improving the men's restroom facility in the Tabernacle and renovating the old restroom and shower house behind Jubilee. We are also planning to replace the roofs on Jubilee and Centennial with local volunteer help. A group of youth and their leaders are coming to renovate some of the cabins. These projects will require some permits and materials. If you would care to assist with this need, please indicate **facility improvements** on your check. To volunteer your physical help, call the office!

Thank you for your continued prayers and support for OCC and the staff and the Board. We know you are praying for we see the answers daily!
