FINANCIAL PLANNING MINISTRY

At their February Board meeting, the OCC Board voted to join the Oregon Consortium of Financial Planning Ministry. Based in Southern California for over 20 years FPM provides seminars, legal counsel, and a process by which Living Trusts are created. Sponsors of FPM, such as OCC, host seminars at which the Living Trust is explained and attendees are given help in the process of creating a Living Trust. A Living Trust avoids probate court and speeds up the process by which heirs may receive intended distribution of assets.

WiNeMa Christian Camp, OCEF, NWCEA, and Turner Retirement Homes are the other four members of the Oregon Consortium. OCC will sponsor an information seminar at the Convention this summer, on Wednesday afternoon, June 27. Plan to attend if you are interested in learning about this valuable vehicle of stewardship. Younger families as well as single adults are encouraged to consider this also.

Association with FPM will encourage Church members and supporters of OCC to include OCC in their estate planning. This is promoted and possible because the creating of a Living Trust through FPM carries no cost. Those who complete a Trust are encouraged to at least give money saved by not paying for the creation of a Living Trust, to one of many sponsors of FPM, of which OCC is now one. OCC pays a monthly fee to participate, which for the time being is being personally underwritten by Board members and friends of OCC, over and above other support.

The Speaker Who Didn't Show Up

The 1960 Convention met the summer before my sophomore year in High School. Ard Hoven and Perry Epler Gresham were the main speakers for that Convention, but the one who had a direct bearing on my life was the speaker who did not show up.



During those Conventions special youth-oriented sessions were planned for the tabernaclesometimes on Saturday evenings, sometimes on Sunday afternoon. On Sunday, July 3, of

the 1960 Convention was scheduled an "Assembly of Christian Youth" for 2:30 P.M. It had been publicized that then Oregon Governor Mark O. Hatfield was to be the speaker for that youth assembly. But the Governor got sick at the last minute, and was unable to make that appointment.

So into the breach stepped Medford Jones. Medford preached a challenging message to those youth assembled, confronting us with the summons to "full-time Christian service." At the invitation to make such a commitment, I stepped out and pledged myself to the ministry as God would lead me. It is a call and a choice I have never regretted.

That, in part is why my loyalty to the Oregon Christian Convention remains strong, and why our family participates each year (even as "foreigners and aliens" from Washington). Interestingly, the theme for the 1960 Convention was "Now Is the Hour," under the larger theme of "The Decade of Decision." It was the right hour for me, and it was definitely a significant deci-
